I. Approval of SES Providers Approval of Agreement between McFarland Unified School District and the following Supplemental Educational Service/Providers: #1 Educando con Tabletas, A Tree of Knowledge, Datamatics, Inc. (dba Achieve High Points), Alpha Innovation Through Education, Carter Reddy and Associates, Inc., Cesar Chavez Foundation, Growing Scholars Educational Center, Ipad Tutoring, LLC, Professional Tutors of America, Inc., Studentnest, Inc (dbastudentnest.com) Sullivan Learning Systems, Inc., & Sylvan Learning.

On January 8, 2002, President Bush signed his education plan, No Child Left Behind, into Law. As part of that law, when a disadvantaged child is attending a low performing school, federal funds can be used to provide supplemental services for that child. Parents of eligible children can choose from the list of state-approved providers. When parents have made their selection, the District must then contract with that provider to deliver services. The law requires that supplemental education service providers adhere to high-quality, research-based instruction. The law states that a provider must continue to provide SES to eligible students until the end of the school year in which those services were first received. Many of our students are in need of supplemental services and this approval will allow us to provide tutoring for 278 students. The selection of students is determined by need (FFB, BB, B). This extra help can be provided before or after school, on weekends, or in the summer. Funding: Categorical Funds Resource: Title 1. Approval is requested.

J. Approval of Revised Board Policy BP 6146.1 – First Reading

With the creation and participation of a cohort of students in the Paramount Agricultural Career Academy (PACA), the scope and sequence that was established by all parties involved and must be followed inhibits students participating in PACA from meeting the requirement of physical education (PE) without having to take an extra ordinary amount of courses, as mandated by CA Ed. Code Section 51220(d) and our BP & AR 6146.1. Currently, our BP 6146.1 states: "To obtain a high school diploma, students shall complete at least the following courses in grades 9-12, with each course being one year unless otherwise specified: Two courses in physical education, unless the student has been otherwise exempted pursuant to other sections of the Education Code (Education Code 51225.3)" Therefore, we can recognize and give five (5) credits up to twenty (20) credits to those high school students that are engaged and complete a full season (those students who do not complete season due to medical reasons & provide a note from a licensed physician shall be given credit) in any regular school-sponsored interscholastic athletic program carried on wholly or partially after regular hours (ED Code 51242). Such sports currently recognized by the McFarland Unified School Governing Board of Trustees consist of: football, volleyball, cross country, tennis, wrestling, basketball, baseball, softball, track & field and cheerleading.
