C. Approval of Resolution #1415-18 Education Protection Account Funds

Pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution, school districts, county offices of Education, and community college districts are required to determine how the moneys received from the Education Protection Account (EPA) are spent in the school or schools within its jurisdiction, proved that the governing board makes the spending determinations in an open session of a public meeting. The language in the constitutional amendment requires that funds shall not be used for the salaries and benefits of administrators or any other administrative costs. McFarland Unified School District is expected to receive approximately \$4,646,466 in EPA funds. These funds will be used to pay for Instructional Salaries and Benefits that directly affect our students. The district will annually post on their website an accounting of how much money was received from EPA and how that money was spent. Approval is requested.

	The Board shall consider and may adopt findings pursuant to Government Code section 4217.12 that the anticipated cost of the energy conservations services contract proposed by Climatec LLC is less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of thermal, electrical, or other energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of the energy conservation service contract proposed by Climatec LLC and that it is in the best interest of the District to approve and enter into the energy conservation services contract with Climatec LLC. The Board shall consider and may adopt certain findings pursuant to Government Code Sections 4127.12 and 4217.13 that funds for the repayment of the energy conservations services are projected to be available from the energy savings anticipated to result from the energy conservations services contract proposed by Climatec LLC, representing funds that otherwise would have been used for purchase of electrical, thermal, or other energy required by the District in the absence of the energy conservation services provided under the energy conservations services contract proposed by Climatec LLC and that it is in the best interest of the District to approve. Formal bids were advertised and mandatory job walks were held at both sites. Bids were received and reviewed with the architect and District staff. The apparent low bidder for both sites is Pacific Contractors Group. The base bids include all painting with alternates for a polymer finish coat, and alternates for the relocatables at BRS. The total cost for Browning Road School is \$380,000 and the cost for Kern Avenue is \$350,000 for a total of \$730,000. There will also be additional costs associated at both sites for repairs to dry rot that will be based on a square footage or linear footage fee as needed. Contracts will be finalized.
