	C.	Approval of Resolution #1516-03 Regarding Extended-Day Kindergarten/Early Development Program
		Pursuant to Education Code section 8973, the kindergarten school day in an early primary program conducted pursuant to Education Code section 8972 may exceed four hours, exclusive of recesses, provided that: (i) it shall not exceed the length of the primary school day; and (ii) the extended day kindergarten program takes into account ample opportunity for both active and quiet activities within an integrated, experiential, and developmentally appropriate educational program. In order to operate an extended day kindergarten, Education Code section 8973(a) also requires the governing board of a school district to "declare" that the program does not exceed the length of the primary school day; and the Board of Trustees have been advised and believes that the District's extended day kindergarten program is in full compliance with the conditions of Education Code section 8973. D.	Approval of Resolution #1516-04 Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016
	The Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 provides for the construction of new school facilities, renovations and upgrade of existing classrooms, construction of new classrooms to accommodate growth, and for career technical education facilities to provide job training to meet the trained workforce needs of California's employers. The Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 will not raise State taxes and State matching funds will reduce the need for additional local property taxes for school facilities. Approval is requested.

Approval of SES Provider Agreements between McFarland Unified School District and the following Supplemental Educational Service Providers: Above & Beyond, Learning Inc.; #1 Academia de Servicio de Tutoria; Alpha! Innovation Through Education; #1 in Learning Online, Inc.; A Tree of Knowledge Educational Services, Inc.; Sylvan Learning; A Better Tomorrow Education; Access to Learning; & Cesar Chavez Foundation.
	On January 8, 2002, President Bush signed his education plan, No Child Left Behind, into Law. As part of that law, when a disadvantaged child is attending a low performing school, federal funds can be used to provide supplemental services for that child. Parents of eligible children can choose from the list of state-approved providers. When parents have made their selection, the District must then contract with that provider to deliver services. The law requires that supplemental education service providers adhere to high-quality, research-based instruction. The law states that a provider must continue to provide SES to eligible students until the end of the school year in which those services were first received. Many of our students are in need of supplemental services and this approval will allow us to provide tutoring for 240 students. The selection of students is determined by need. This extra help can be provided before or after school, on weekends. Funding Source: 20% of Title 1 Funding. Approval is requested.

	The State of California, Department of Education, has funded a grant to the Kern Early Stars (KES) program for conducting Quality Rating Improvement System (QRIS) assessment and quality improvement activities of State Preschools. The Kern Consortium was awarded \$1,651,258 to be distributed among qualifying preschools. This agreement will allow the Kern Early Stars and/or First 5 Impact to assist our district with the quality improvement activities and assessments in order to be awarded extra funding. 	Approval is requested for Work Authorization #29 with Teter LLP. (The Master Agreement with Tayor Teter for architectural services is dated October 15, 2008.) The scope includes the construction of a new Permanent Modular building programmed for a new student weight/wrestling room facility. This work authorization will provide architectural, mechanical, electrical and civil engineering services for these projects. (see W/A for more details) This Work Authorization shall be a 9% fee based on site and accessibility and a 8.5% fee on the building based on estimated construction costs. 9% of \$335,000 for site & accessibility = \$30,150 and 8.5% of \$1,200,000 for the building = \$102.000 for architectural fees. Total estimated fees are \$132,150. Approval is requested.
