		On January 8, 2002, President Bush signed his education plan, No Child Left Behind, into Law. The law united both political parties behind the principle that schools must be held accountable for their results and that every child must learn. As part of that law, when a disadvantaged child is attending a low performing school, federal funds can be used to provide supplemental services for that child. Parents of eligible children can choose from the list of state-approved providers. When parents have made their selection, the District must then contract with that provider to deliver the services. The law requires that supplemental education service providers adhere to high-quality, research-based instruction. The law states that a provider must continue to provide SES to eligible students until the end of the school year in which those services were first received.
