В.	McFarland High School requests that the Board approve the following expenditure: \$10, 000 from Title I categorical budget to fund the 8 <sup>th</sup> period intervention program.								
	This budget item was approved by the MHS Site Council on Jan. 20, 2009. The 8 <sup>th</sup> period after school intervention will target those students who have multiple fails and are struggling with their studies. Funding will pay for 10 teachers to provide a total of 200 hours of intensive instruction to students with low GPA's. Approval is requested.

C.	Approval of McFarland High School expenditures: \$11,367.44 from the Discretionary Block Grant categorical budget to purchase an electronic readerboard from Signtronix and \$12,500 from the Discretionary Block Grant categorical budget to pay for the Magic Mountain reward trip for students who jumped one performance level on the 2008 CST.								
	Many high schools in the valley have installed electronic readerboards in the front of their schools. These readerboards help to keep parents, students and the community informed of school events and activities. The readerboard that we intend to purchase is very similar to the one in front of Wasco High School. Last year's reward trip to Magic Mountain played an important part in encouraging our students to give their best effort on the California Standards Test. This is a great way to reward those students who gave 100% effort and raised their scores to a higher performance level. Approval is requested.

	F.	Approval to Apply to E-Rate to use Verizon for T-1 Interconnection of sites.										
		E-Rate pays up to 90% of communication expenses for eligible schools and libraries. We are applying to have E-Rate cover the eligible cost of the T-1 connections in the district. The current cost is \$2133.50 per month to the district for a total of \$25,602 per year. By applying to E-Rate the final cost to the District will be approximately \$2560.20. Approval is requested.

	G.	Approval of Resolution #0809-07 approving Behavioral Intervention Plans (Hughes Bill) Mandated Cost Claim Settlement and Waiving Rights to File any Claim regarding the Hughes Bill Statute and regulations in the future.										
		In response to legislation (AB 2586, the Hughes Bill), the State Board of Education in 1993 adopted regulations requiring LEA's to develop BIP's for special education students who exhibit serious behavioral problems. The regulations imposed detailed and costly requirements that exceed federal law. This claim has been tied up in the mandate reimbursement process and in the courts for over 14 years. In the Resolution the board: Approves the settlement which will bring the District approximately \$14.85 per 2007-08 ADA, \$45,642.50 annually for the six-year period beginning 2011-12 through 2016-17, Agrees to waive its ability to file future mandated cost claims on the Hughes Bill statute and regulations are currently worded; Directs the District's authorized representative to sign the Waiver to implement this action. The legislature's obligation to fund the settlement is contingent on 85% of all districts, county offices of education, and special education local plan areas constituting 92% of statewide ADA waiving their rights to file additional mandated cost claims on the current Hughes Bill statute and regulations. Approval is requested.
