**Public Communication** 

Rick Sparks had comments regarding Closed Session item A. He comments regarding discipline & dismissal. He asked that the board use the same criteria and the same things that are used for teachers should also be used with administrators in the school district as well and not put them on some kind of pedestal. In a meeting with Mr. McCurtis last year he stressed the importance of looking for "A+ teachers" and he agreed with him. He added, "as for Administrators, they are supposed to be our educational leaders and why can't they be expected to be "A+" as well. When people are abusive, when administrators are abusive, inappropriate, unprofessional, their people skills are bad and people feel harassed. That's not professional behavior and that goes on in several of our schools with several of our administrators. He asked that the board take a look at the situation in regards to the March deadline. He

stated that he doesn't like answering and trying to defend the administrators. When he gets a complaint about administrators and something that happened, he looks at it and usually doesn't do too much about it. He may take a strong look into it. He continued, "But when it happens over and over and over again." One administrator that he is concerned about has had four, maybe five official complaints filed at the district, two by teachers, one by classified and one by a parent. To me this is not appropriate behavior and the least we should do is cover ourselves so if the behavior and what goes on doesn't improve from March 15th till the end of May, that we're not stuck with this person. You need to take a look at the morale of the teachers and what they're looking at coming back to as well. If I look at what they're coming back to, I know how I felt when my former principal was there and I had to come back to him and what it did for my morale. Think of the people at these schools. We have two in particular with that have very impersonal skills in dealing with teachers, dealing with people out in public, yelling, demanding and things like that are inappropriate." He went on, "The district even agreed on one complaint that a very biased, harassing thing happened to this teacher and there was nothing, the administrator was sent to training or something like that. I hope that every time when the future teachers mess up that the school district will say, ok, we'll pay for you to go to training." He concluded, "So this is my concern and I hope that the administrators will be addressed tonight. I am not asking for firing of anybody, just take a good solid look and start talking to people more than Mr. McCurtis. I respect Mr. McCurtis and his opinion, but it is not the only opinion and not the only feedback. Thank you"

## **Community Input**

Board President stated that there were a couple of gentlemen that wanted to speak but that it was taken care of. He asked CBO Candi Clark to come up and give a briefing on the baseball team. She stated that the gentlemen wanted to use the baseball field for a game on Sunday. After talking to them she asked that they provide insurance before they are allowed to use the field.

## Superintendent's Report:

Superintendent McCurtis gave the attendance report.

- 1. Attendance Superintendent Gabriel McCurtis gave the attendance report in which he stated that the monthly total was 3176 students enrolled. One month ago there were 3145 and one year ago there were 3179 students. He stated, "Since the last board meeting the State did contact us and let us know that of the ninety-eight districts getting sanctions we were 28. That meant we had a moderate sanction. It calls for a DAIT team, a District Assistance Intervention Team that will come in and they will help us to do what needs to be done to make Program Improvement. Tomorrow, myself, Mrs. Clark and Mrs. McManaman will be going to Sacramento. We will have a chance to address the State Board of Education in terms of things that are affecting us and our P.I. status and I will give you more feedback when that is over."
- 2. CSBA delegates were chosen and submitted to CSBA. Motion made by Rey DeLeon, seconded by David Arguello to select Parks and Lockheed as Delegates to CSBA. Motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

Supt. McCurtis thanked the Board President and the Board. He also added that the awning was complete at Browning Road School thanks to the MOT Dept. Also the High School will be having their WASC accreditation coming up within the next few months and that the principal Mr. Martin Schmidt is doing an outstanding job their as their instructional leader there at the high school. He concluded his report.

Ramon Melendez – Board President stated that the March 15th deadline affecting our District is also affecting everyone statewide. It is that time of the year for the March 15<sup>th</sup> deadline. He thanked all staff from the Supt. on down for all their hard work that has been done. Everyone knows the things that they have been through the last two years to now. He stated that for the board members and the discussion from earlier they will be taking into consideration all input brought to them. He again thanked the community.

#### **Presentations**

- 1. MHS Counselors Christy Bowman and Regina Cardoso They distributed a College Counseling Handbook. They gave the mission statement: To help our students and their families understand the importance of obtaining a college or post high school education. To provide each of our students with the opportunities needed to prepare them for success in college. To provide our students and their families with the information they need to make informed decisions about college choices, application processes, and financial aid. They mentioned some of the Programs offered from Bakersfield College as: Outreach, EOPS, Supportive Services. The Vocational/Trade Schools mentioned were: San Joaquin Valley College, Santa Barbara Business School, Truck Driving School, Art Institue of Southern California, Lyles College of Beauty, UTI and Military Opportunities. They proceeded to state the steps for admission to the universities, Financial Aid is: Grants, Scholarships, Loans, Work-Study. They recommend that all seniors complete the FAFSA application for Student Aid which must be completed by March 2<sup>nd</sup>. They gave the requirements for scholarship applications. The hand book included all this information. They reported that the high school was used as an SAT test tine and had received an e-mail requesting an increase to 5 test days. The site has a positive impact for Delano and Wasco as well as McFarland.
- 2. Summer Academy Sam Ramirez Vice Mayor of Delano and Grace Vallejo Mayor of Delano Reported on the Summer Academy and Sam stated he had been working at McFarland High School for two years. He stated that the students need somewhere to go and something to do. They are hosting the Summer Academy in Delano and have a couple of spots for McFarland. They provide three activities, snacks and a safe environment for students. It includes Earlimart, McFarland, Pond and Delano. They both stressed the importance and significance of the Summer Academy in regards to the students. They distributed a flyer and application to the board members regarding program. The cost to attend is Free, with lunch and snacks provided. They also stressed that space was limited to 500 kids from 10-16 years of age. Some of the activities include: Basketball, Swimming, Volleyball, Track and Field, Karate, Dance, Computers/Windows Movie Maker/Internet and Painting. The program would include 100 kids from McFarland for a cost of \$5,000 and would require transportation. The time frame would be from 12:45 for pickup to 4:00 return. The Summer Academy would take place from June 18<sup>th</sup> to July 13<sup>th</sup>. He added that they are asking for collaboration with the school district for this program.

Board Vice President thanked Mr. Ramirez and added that he is familiar with this program and would like to recommend it. He added regarding the ROC program and the benefits of the Summer Academy. He would like to see it happen for our district.

Mayor Grace Vallejo added that this program would promote the door between the two communities. They both thanked the board.

Reports

- MHS Martin Schmidt gave the McFarland High School presentation. He proceeded: heightened awareness of their goal to increase gains in student achievement are: API Goal - 628 in 2008, CAHSEE Goal - 75% of 10th graders pass, AYP Goals: English - 34% proficient and Math - 35% proficient; Academic Support: English and Math support classes for all below basic and far below basic students, CAHSEE prep classes for all seniors who have not passed, Math and English tutoring available after school, CAHSEE prep classes available after school, and ELD support classes for all EL Students: Using Data to Drive Instruction: Quarterly benchmark assessments, Data is scanned into Edusoft database, Teachers using data analysis to identify areas of curriculum needing to be retaught; Teacher Collaboration: English, math, science and social studies departments each conducted a formal walkthrough and debrief process, All teachers worked together in focus groups on WASC review; Teacher Collaboration: English teachers meeting weekly to design lessons and assist one another; Technology as an Instructional Tool: 13 Smartboards were installed, Teachers trained to use Smartboards, Computer Labs used constantly for: College Ed., Reading Intervention, Math Intervention, Computer/Graphics; Building a "College-Going-Culture": College Ed. Curriculum for all 9th graders, Exposure to "My Road" for 10th-12th graders, College Night with speaker Dolores Huerta, Many students attend the College Fair, Financial Aid & college planning appointments, Scholarships being awarded throughout the year, College banners hung in the main hall, gym and cafeteria, College tagline was created by our students; Renovations to The Campus: Built an office for the registrar, Divided a large classroom to gain additional classroom space, New concrete sidewalks, new gym windows, Parking lot resurfacing; Athletic Success: Boys Football had an exciting season, Boy's Cross Country finished 3rd in State, Boys Basketball were league champs, Girls' Basketball were league champs, Girls Volleyball had 28 wins and 3 losses; The High School has a strong Fine Arts Program, the choir put on a wonderful Christmas Concert, the Band played at all home FB games and marched in two parades, the Art students produce and display wonderful pieces of art; they have a strong Discipline Plan with in School Suspension, Saturday School & After School and lunch detention; They are also continuing work on the Single Plan for Student Achievement, the Dept. members have worked on revising and updating the SPSA, the School Site Council has worked to review and update the SPSA and the SPSA will be submitted to the Board of Education for Approval; Regarding the Accreditation the entire staff worked on the WASC report, the report has been approved by the School Site Council and the Board of Education, The WASC visiting team will be here March 30 - April 2, a Reception will be held on March 30 from 4:30 to 5:00 p.m. and Board members are encouraged to attend; Special Programs at McFarland High include, AVID, AP Classes, FFA, and VTC; Clubs and Activities are PEP Assemblies, Breast Cancer Awareness Week and Club ED Project; Some of the needs for the future at McFarland High are: Additional Classrooms to include a computer lab, science lab, room for IS and offices for New Counselor and Curriculum Coach, Also needed are a full time Band Teacher, New Exterior Doors (gym, office building and shop building), and Electronic Reader Board.
- 2. Technology & Information Services Tabled to next meeting
- 3. Annual Autism Awareness Conf. District Rep./Special Education Melissa Melendez "Good evening Supt, Board Members and Staff. I am Melissa Martinez-Melendez the Districts Community Advisory Committee Representative for the Student Support Services Department. I am here to thank you in person for allowing myself and one of our special education parents to attend the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Autism Awareness Conference. The speakers o this year's Autism Awareness Conference were Drs. Robert & Lynn Koegel. They are directors of the Koegel Autism Center at the University of California, Santa Barbara. They are actively involved in the development of programs to improve communication in children with Autism, an in providing support and intervention services in school districts, within California and throughout the United States. Today, 1 in150 individuals is diagnosed with autism, making it more common that pediatric cancer, diabetes and AIDS combined. Having been given the opportunity to attend this year's conference gave us the opportunity to listen and interact with the speakers as well as other

people who are involved with helping children with autism who are being serviced in our district and to our parent in working with her own child. Children with autism are often misunderstood. If we continue to learn as much as we can about working with these children there will continue to be great hope for the progress to come. We can become the proper support system they need so that they too can be productive individuals in society.

- 4. MTA - Rick: Stated that he had something positive to add. First MTA just sent 12 teachers Anaheim to the "Good Teachers Conference". Regarding negotiations, they are going very well. It is sometimes a frustrating process. He feels strongly that with their team and the District Office team working together will be a "win, win" situation. In regards to negotiations he had nothing negative except impatience to report. They have not reached an agreement vet. Also, he added that the idea of teamwork to make a dream work is a good idea. He commented regarding his monthly meetings with the Supt. and that he had to wait too long in the lobby at the last meeting in November or December. He added that two grievances since Jan. 2006 had not been responded to. He added that at times, "we really feel like we're not important." He added that in the January minutes he had read on the presentation by Mrs. Burgh on the Professional Learning Communities and added that CTA wholeheartedly supports this if done correctly. He added that he feels obligated to respond to PLC because they are the future and said, "get teachers involved in the training and the teaching." He also commented on the Golden Handshake and the need to get the Resolution approved soon if possible since there was a problem from last year and two teachers didn't get it last year and the district is trying to resolve this. This is a retirement issue. He asked, "How Important are the teachers?" He does support the changes being made and that MTA had a lot to do with the changes needing to be made. He stressed the importance of talking to the teachers. He stated that he appreciated the board listening that he didn't need to feel negative and thanked the board.
